

## Report on ISTE Faculty Convention Program 2019 On 30<sup>th</sup> and 31<sup>st</sup> October, 2019

Entrepreneurship and startups are only a recent phenomenon in the country. It is only in the last decade and half that people in the country have moved from being job seekers to job creators. Doing a startup is tough hence an entrepreneur needs to be prepared to face failures and unprecedented hardship.

It was everyone's pleasure to hear from Mr Alok Sharma, who leads KOMPANIONS on Product Management and Strategic Alliances. He has focused on creating Immersive Experiences via AR VR for Education, Healthcare, Manufacturing and Defence. In a short span of 4 years, he has collaborated with global players like Pearson, Oxford, NIIT, Adani, Tata Projects, Hindalco and various Government organisations such as Government of Rajasthan, DRDO. The first speaker was Mr Saurabh Trivedi. He is an entrepreneur, intellectual property enthusiast, business consultant, investor and season trademark attorney. The main focus of his talk was to highlight the challenges and the need of marketing a startups. management, time management and social awareness regarding various programmes.

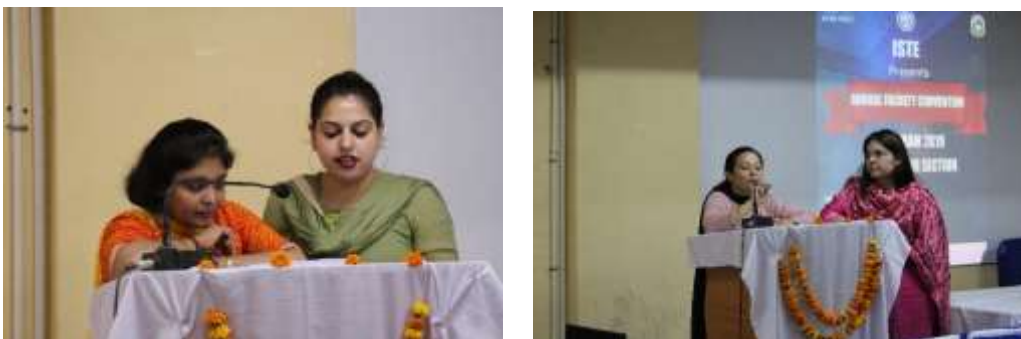

A total of 15 team participated in first round, out of which 8 were selected for second round. Finally three teams were declared winners after second round.
